1. Welcome and Introductions
2. MI State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) – Ann Mueller, Resource Specialist, muellera@michigan.gov, 517-335-1137
 - MSHDA now following up on children with EBLs of 5 or higher with one test in voucher housing statewide (previously was following up on children with EBLs of 15 or higher with two tests)
 - MSHDA gets the list from MDHHS and notifies housing agent(s) for each county to either complete a risk assessment (common areas only) paid for by MSHDA or to verify that a risk assessment has been completed. Landlord is informed of the repairs needed.

3. MDHHS Healthy Homes Section – James Copeland, Senior Compliance Officer, copelandj3@michigan.gov, 517-284-4797
 - Lead Safe Home Program is a statewide program for families that meet the qualifications (like living in targeted areas or a child has an EBL of 5 or greater). LSHP is unded by multiple sources like CHIP and HUD.
 - Landlord penalty law:
 - Must have minor child under 19 with 10 venous or higher
 - Hazard has to be identified
 - Under EBL investigation
 - Landlord has 90 days after they are notified make a good faith effort to correct lead issues before enforcement can take place.
 - Good faith efforts could include but doesn't have specific requirements.
 - participate in lead program
 - Have documented planning, contracts signs, or is certified to fix the problem themselves.
 - If landlord doesn't sign application lead program, ignores and doesn't want to comply after 90 days, send letter is sent asking what was done, who did the work, and if they received clearance.
 - If they don't respond then MDHHS is able to fine them \$2000 per day per instance.
 - If the county prosecutor chooses to pressure criminal action the landlord could face 93 in jail, \$5,000 fine.
4. Monthly Medicaid Lead Report (replacing the Monthly Medicaid Fee-for-Service Lead Report)
 - Lists children 6 and under enrolled in Medicaid. Indicates what they are enrolled in. Is like Service Lead Report but is more expanded. There are about 6,000 rows per spreadsheet, advised users to use filters. Not obligated to use. Veronica advised that is

too difficult to combine Monthly Medicaid Lead Report with weekly reports at this time as some children have multiple Medicaid ID #s, but will look into this for the future.

5. Balguti Kesaria
 - Ayurvedic remedy sent from India. Press Release from MDHHS and FDA alert in regards to the high lead levels in this product went out last week, be aware of this when conducting home visits.
6. Care Coordination Agreements

7. Quarter 3 Reimbursement
 - Indicate if children are siblings
 - Submit all documentation (FSR, Spreadsheet, FSR Supplemental Form), even if 0 home visits were completed for the quarter
 - Ensure that the Plan of Care and Assessment are uploaded in HHLPSS
 - Ensure that the child has a venous confirmatory test
 - Verify in CHAMPS that the child is Medicaid eligible at the time of the home visit

 - Testing Reminders – 1 to 3 months, HHLPSS is set to remind at 2 months
