4. **National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week (October 21 – 27) –** An e-mail was sent out with draft social media posts on 10/17/18. Please share any pictures of events or displays taking place in your jurisdiction with CLPPP.
5. **Policies on Individual BLL Result Dissemination and CLPPP’s Definition of Unrounded EBLLs –** two new policies about how test results are displayed are available on [www.miclppp.org](http://www.miclppp.org). Results are now distributed as unrounded numbers, EBLL cut point is 4.5 µg/dL (same level as previous since 4.5-4.9 levels were rounded to 5).

7. **Roll Call – EPA Continuing Education Courses Overview –**

- a. The US EPA's Lead-based Paint Program is working with a group of nursing and health education professional and lead poisoning prevention organizations to aid them in developing a series of continuing education courses focused on the topics of lead exposures and preventing childhood lead poisoning for nursing professionals. The groups proposal includes:
    - i. The first course would cover general information about lead, lead exposures, and preventing lead poisoning with additional information about the role of healthcare professionals, including risk quiz questions and tips on how to talk to patients about lead.
    - ii. The second course would focus on resources available to nurses and other healthcare professionals to help them educate their communities and patients about lead and lead poisoning prevention. This course will include examples of print resources, tips on how to talk to your community, and highlight different lead education programs.
    - iii. Subsequent courses would be developed with and for more specific audiences to potentially include minorities, schools, pediatric nurses, etc.

      - 3. As a healthcare professional/educator what information do you or others in your field need to feel comfortable educating community members about preventing lead poisoning?
