3. MIALSH Lead Education Day
 - The Michigan Alliance for Lead Safe Homes (MIALSH) is putting on their Annual Lead Education Day at the Capital on Thursday, March 14th. This is a day long event giving you the opportunity to meet with Representatives and Senators let them know that ending lead poisoning is a top priority for you.
4. Funding Opportunities
 - Child Lead Exposure Elimination Commission RFP
 - This is the second year the lead commission has put out an RFP for grants that demonstrate innovative approaches to the elimination of child lead exposure and have the potential to be replicated throughout the state.
 - Applications are due in the MI E-Grants system by Tuesday, February 26th at 3 p.m.
 - 2019 Lead Poisoning Prevention Grants: Equipping Communities for Action through the National Lead Poisoning Prevention Network.
 - The National Center for Healthy Housing has a funding opportunity to help communities build local capacity and advance evidence-based lead poisoning prevention efforts Applications are due by 5 p.m. on Friday, March 22nd.
5. FY18 Annual Narrative Progress Reports Overview
 - Thank you for submitting these reports. They are helpful to us as we are looking at what is working in NCM and what might not be working. There were a lot of recommendations that we are taking into consideration as we make plans for the future.
 - In FY18, there were 1,289 reimbursable home visits completed across the state.
6. Upcoming FY19 Deadline
 - Quarter 1 (October – December 2018) – was due January 30th, working on approving FSRs now.

- Quarter 2 (January – March 2019) Spreadsheets/FSRs/FSR Supplemental Forms – **Due April 30th**.
7. Other Updates/Reminders
 - 2017 Annual Report is in the final review stages and should be published in the next month or so.
 - Every year MPHI does an evaluation of CLPPP, and the survey should be sent out sometime in April, keep an eye out for it.
 - Visit www.miclppp.org to make sure that your LHD contact information is correct.
 8. Roll Call – Relationships with Medicaid Health Plans
 - Summary- Most LHDs have a good relationship with McLaren and receive monthly lists from Molina. It is a good idea to build relationships with the MHPs and to know who to contact if you have questions. MHP contact information can be found on www.miclppp.org.
 - The MHPs are a good resource for things transportation issues, incentives to retesting, contacting families that are lost to follow up.
 - CLPPP has monthly meeting with state Medicaid and can pass along any concerns or barriers.
