2. MiTracking Program – Jill Maras, MPH, Project Manager/Epidemiologist, marasj@michigan.gov, 517-284-4813
 - a. MiTracking portal (www.michigan.gov/mitracking) – web-based system that provides health, population, and environmental data, information and tools – covers childhood lead poisoning data
 - i. Website contains information on what MiTracking is and what types of data are available
 - ii. Childhood lead exposure data is available through 2016 at the county and statewide level
 - iii. Ability to query for
 1. Percentage of children under 6 tested for lead
 2. Number and percentage of children with EBLLs (4.5 and up, rounded to 5)
 3. Census data for age of homes

3. Lead Safe Home Program – Carolyn McKnight, Intake Coordinator, mcknightc1@michigan.gov, 517-284-0061
 - a. Reminders-
 - i. New application available at www.michigan.gov/lead under “Lead Services”, available in English, Spanish, and Arabic languages
 - ii. Carolyn works with communities and families outside of Detroit and Flint. Prefers questions via e-mail, please include house address of the family
 - iii. Reminder that applications are prioritized by EBLLs.
 - iv. Applications received for families that live in communities with their own HUD grant are sent to that community by Carolyn. They send referral letter to applicant but do not notify the LHDs.
 - v. If you have a child that an application has already been submitted for but there hasn't been any action yet and the child's BLL goes up reach to Carolyn and let her know.
 - vi. If someone lives in voucher housing outside of the target areas of Bay City, Niles, Benton Harbor, Saginaw, Warren, and Pontiac, they are required to have an EBL to get an environmental investigation.
4. Data Referent Group – CLPPP's data referent group was formed to give frequent users of CLPPP data a chance to provide input. The first meeting was back in January. The next meeting will take place at the end of May, beginning of June, date is not set yet. The plan for that meeting is to get feedback on the 2017 annual report – which is currently in the approval process. If you
